He kept repeating to my dad that I had been spiked with a substance and had to get to hospital immediately.

It was a horrific night and one that stays with me till now. I was extremely lucky because I was with my family, but unfortunately for so many other people, that is not the case. It scares me the most to think that despite being with my family, the person who spiked me still wanted to put a substance in my drink.
